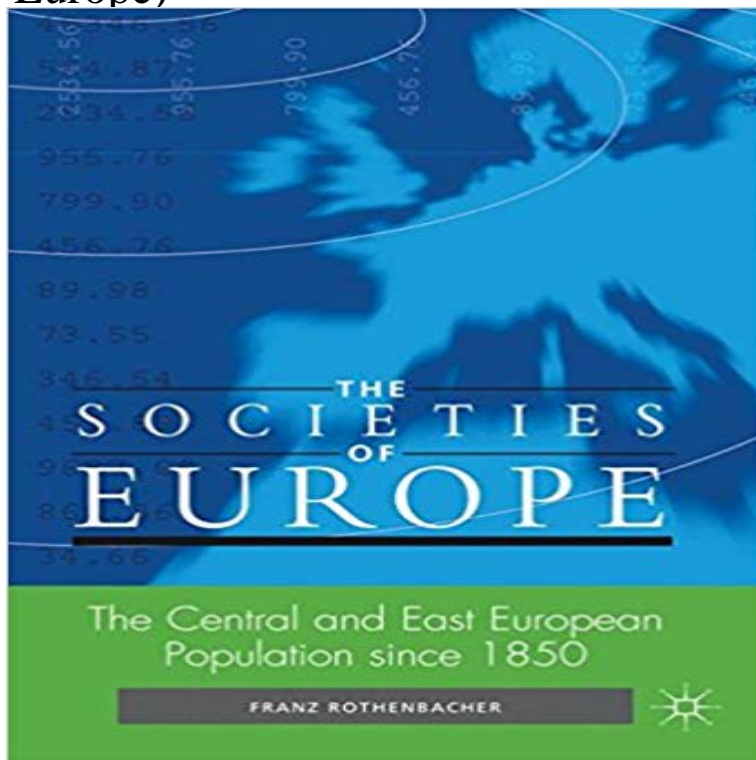


## The Central and East European Population since 1850 (Societies of Europe)
