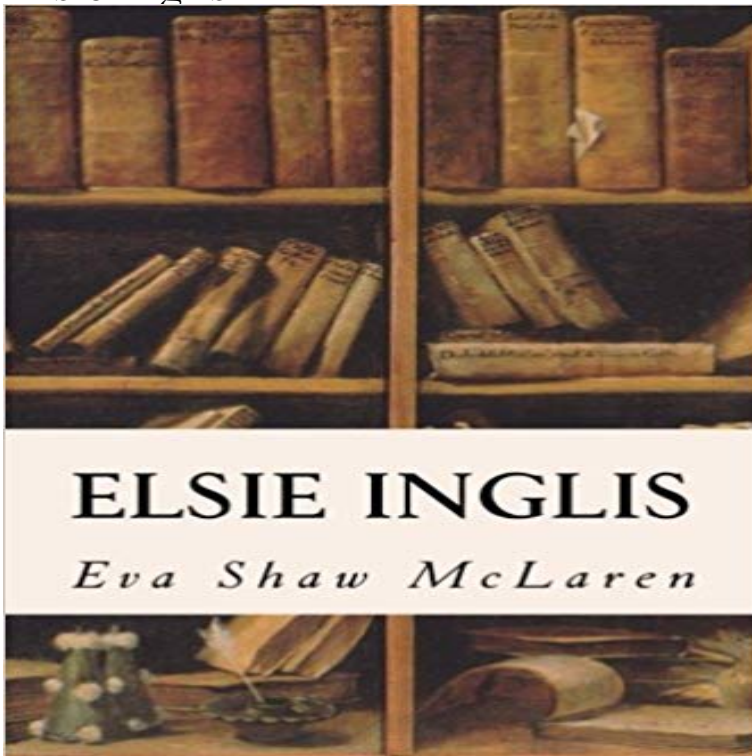


Elsie Inglis
