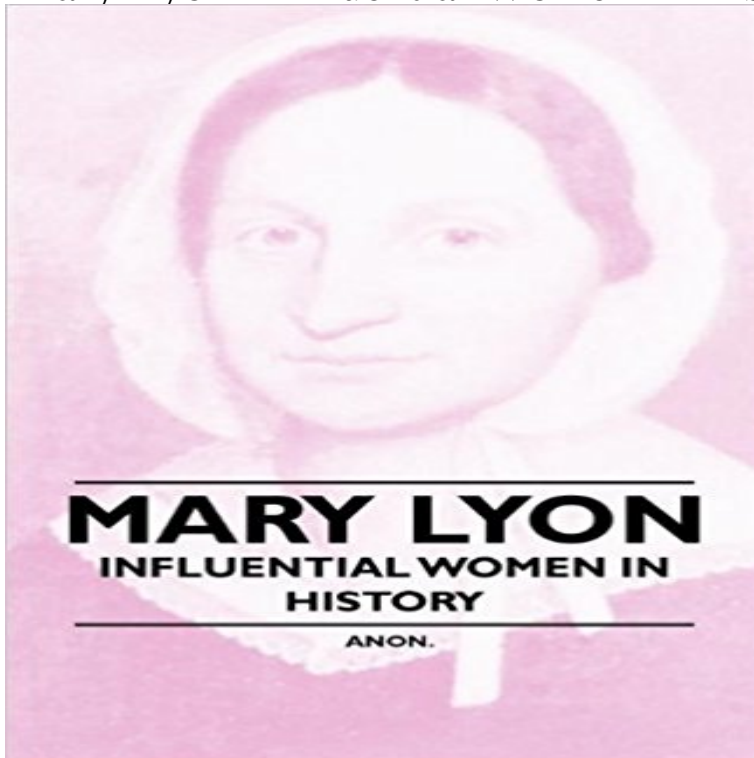


## Mary Lyon - Influential Women in History
