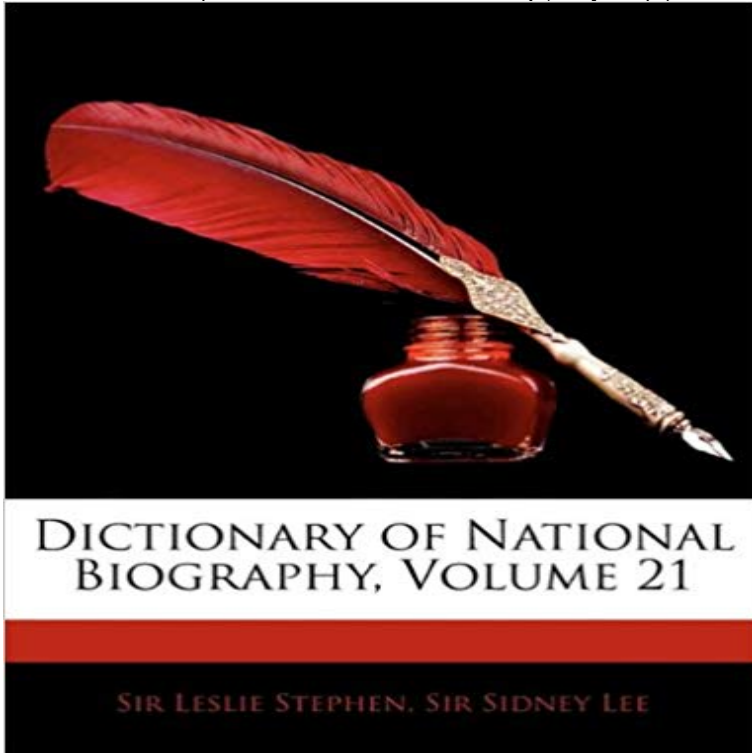


Dictionary of National Biography, Volume 21
