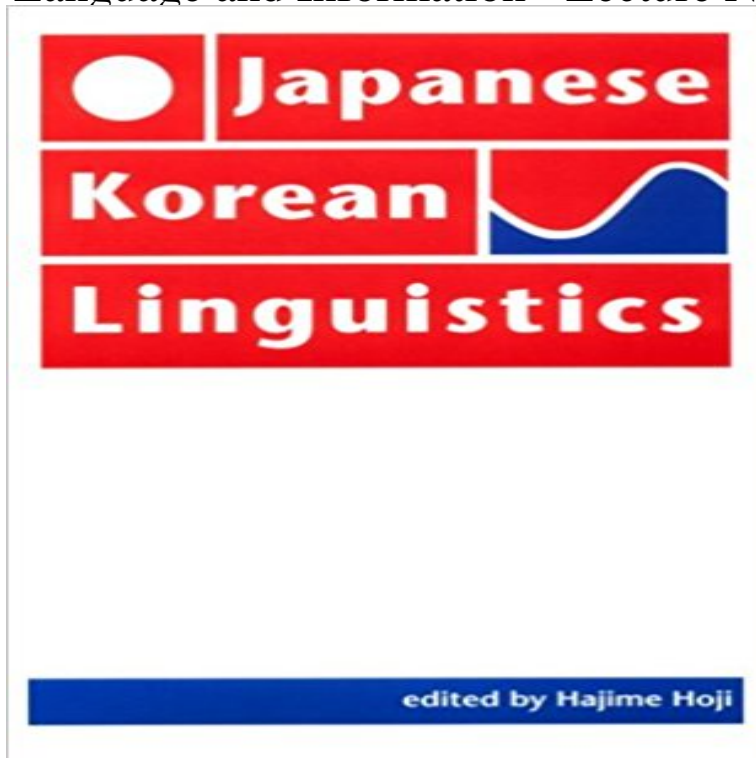


# Japanese/Korean Linguistics, Volume 1 (Center for the Study of Language and Information - Lecture Notes)
