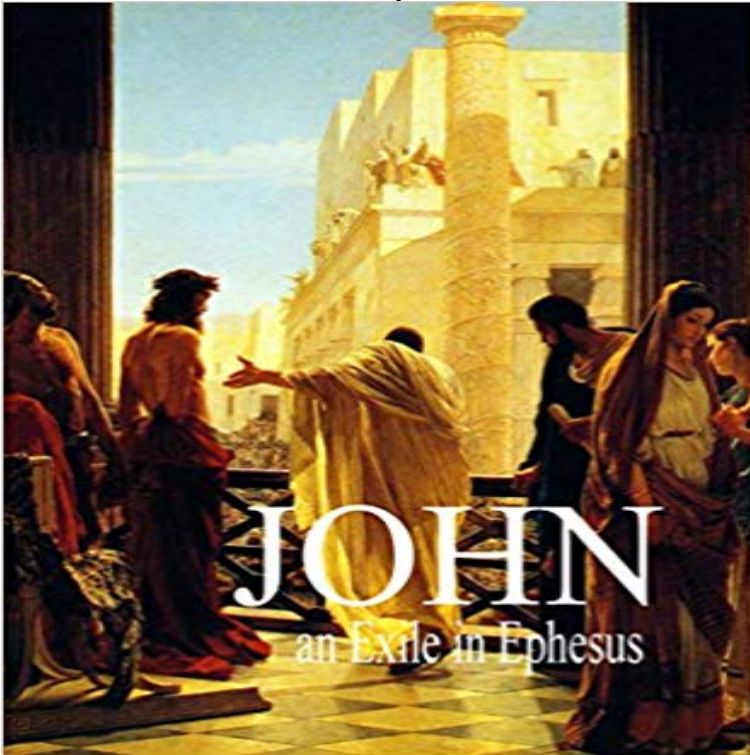


JOHN an Exile in Ephesus
